

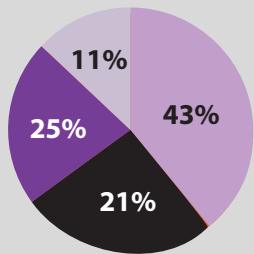

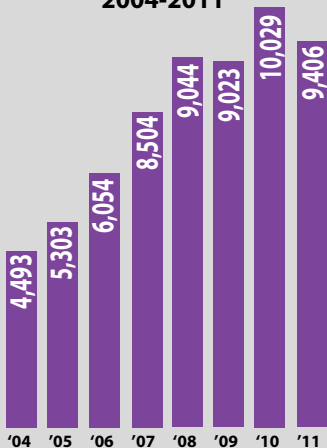
Start Something

The Matches

Big Brothers Big Sisters creates and sustains meaningful, professionally supported matches between adult volunteers and children. Our volunteers go through an extensive background check and careful interview process. Our team provides ongoing support and supervision to the Big, the Little, and the Little's family. The entire matching process, from the initial screening to the final pairing, to graduation — is made possible by donations from people like you.

The Impact

Researchers found that after 18 months of spending time with their mentors, the Little Brothers and Little Sisters in our program, compared to those children not in our program, were:

- 46% less likely to begin using illegal drugs
27% less likely to begin using alcohol
52% less likely to skip school
37% less likely to skip a class
33% less likely to hit someone
